PREPARATION OF THE MANUSCRIPT

SCOPE OF THE JOURNAL

The Baqai Journal of Health Sciences invites articles in medicine, dentistry, pharmaceutical sciences, veterinary sciences, and all related disciplines of health sciences for publication. The journal is published twice a year (Biannual) and allows free access to its articles (Open Access). This journal will provide a vehicle for the young medical scientists, research workers as well as senior scholars, for the exchange of information and publication of their research findings.

BJHS is an open access journal which means that all content is freely available without charge to the user or his/her institution. Users are allowed to read, download, copy, distribute, print, search, or link to the full texts of the articles, or use them for any other lawful purpose, without asking prior permission from the publisher or the author.

PUBLICATION ETHICS

All manuscripts submitted to the journal should be free of plagiarism with respect to ideas, data, words, graphic materials or other forms of communication. However, every submitted article will be checked through 'Turnitin' for similarity. In case of high similarity (overall >19% or more than 5% for a single source) the authors need to resubmit the manuscript after revision. The data presented in the manuscript should be unpublished. Authors shall be responsible for the originality and quality of the manuscript. All authors are requested to disclose any actual or potential conflict of interest. The authors must also mention the funding source of the study in the acknowledgment section (if any). All authors should be aware of and in agreement with the submission of this manuscript and share responsibility for its content. Related research in the field should be acknowledged in the manuscript through appropriate literature citations. All manuscripts will be considered for reviewing with an understanding that they are solely submitted to the Baqai Journal of Health Sciences and are not under simultaneous consideration by any other journal.

Those studies that involve patient(s), their identification, photographs, reports, etc. should only be used after the consent of the patient or parent or guardian (whichever applicable). Authors should remove patients' names from figures unless they have obtained written consent from the patients. All submissions containing such information are believed to be obtained as per criteria

described above and if required the authors are liable to submit the written consent to the Editorial Office.

TYPES OF MANUSCRIPTS

The following categories of articles are included:

- Original research articles (no word or reference limit).
- Review articles on important and current topics of health sciences (no word limit, minimum of 40 references required).
- Mini reviews (word count should not exceed 3000 words and at least 15 and maximum of 40 references are required).
- Case reports of educational value (word count should not exceed 1500 words with maximum of 15 references).
- Short communications for a quick dissemination of information (word count should not exceed 1500 words with maximum of 25 references).
- Letters to editor and commentary (word count should not exceed 1000 words with maximum of 10 references).
- Book review (word count should not exceed 1000 words with maximum of 5 references).
- Announcements regarding important meetings, workshops, seminars and other events relating to Health Sciences at National and International level.

PREPARATION OF THE MANUSCRIPT

Submitted manuscripts are expected to be concise, well organized, and clearly written both in terms of concept and language. The responsibility for all aspects of manuscript preparation rests with the authors. Extensive changes or rewriting of the manuscript will not be undertaken by the editors and may result in the rejection of the article. The authors are strongly recommended to use the <u>template</u> of the desired category in preparation of the manuscript. The following points should be considered during the preparation of the manuscript:

- 1. The preferred font is 'Times New Roman' with a size of 12 (see <u>template</u>).
- 2. The text should be in single column format with double spacing between the lines. Try to keep the layout of the text as simple as possible (see template).
- 3. The text in the manuscript should be justified (see template).
- 4. The authors should use either British or American English throughout the preparation of the manuscript. A combination of both types will not be acceptable. Kindly refer to your language settings option in Microsoft (MS) Word.
- 5. The articles should be check for spelling and grammar by using such options in the MS Office to avoid unnecessary errors.
- 6. Define all abbreviations on their first use in the manuscript.

- 7. Number all the sections and their subsections from Introduction to References. Keep the subsections to maximum of 4 levels as exemplified (also see the <u>template</u>):
 - 1. MAIN HEADING (full capital, bold)
 - 2. MAIN HEADING (full capital, bold)
 - 2.1. Section (first letter capital of each word, bold)
 - 2.1.1. Sub-section (first letter capital of the initial word, bold)
 - 2.1.1.1. Sub-subsection (first letter capital of the initial word)
- 8. The manuscript should be divided into the following sections:

a Title

Every article should contain an appropriate and concise title as they are of enormous importance for the information retrieval to the reader. Symbols, formulas, or arbitrary abbreviations should not be included in the title. Chemical symbols can be included in the title if they are necessary for the information retrieval.

b. Name and affiliations of the author(s)

The title of the article should be followed by the full name of the author separated by comma in case of more than one author. The affiliation (department, university / organization) with complete postal address of each author should also be provided. If the authors have different departments or organizations, simply differentiate them with a superscript alphabet (for e.g. Syed Riaz Baquar^a, Iqbal Ahmad^b, Kefi Iqbal^c). In cases when there is only one author or if all authors have same affiliation, do not insert any superscript alphabet and simply provide the complete address just after the name(s).

One of the authors should be designated as 'Corresponding Author', who will be responsible for all the correspondence at all stages of refereeing and publication. Differentiate the corresponding author with a superscript star symbol (for e.g. Syed Riaz Baquar^a, Iqbal Ahmad^{b*}, Kefi Iqbal^c). Provide the email address and telephone number (with country and area code) of the corresponding author after the affiliation(s). See templates for further guidance.

c. Abstract

A self-explanatory abstract of 100 to 300 words is required for original research and review articles and up to 150 words for short communications and case reports. The abstract should be in a single paragraph without references. It should state briefly the purpose of the research, the principal results and major conclusions. Footnotes or undefined abbreviations should be avoided. The abstract should be on a separate page followed by the title and authors name (see <u>template</u>). No abstract is required for letters to editor and book reviews.

d. Keywords

Immediately after the abstract (on the same page), provide at least 3 and maximum of 7 keywords. These keywords should reflect the scientific content of the manuscript. Avoid use of words like 'and', 'of', etc.

e. Introduction

This section should start from a separate page after abstract and keywords (see <u>template</u>). The introduction section is mandatory and it should provide adequate background information along with the purpose / objective of the work. Avoid unnecessary detailed literature review.

f. Materials and Methods

This section should appear in the manuscript in continuation after Introduction (see <u>template</u>). It should provide the details of the materials / chemicals and instruments used along with the names of their manufacturer (with city and country). This section should also provide sufficient details of the techniques employed in order to allow the work to be reproduced. Already published methods should be indicated by a reference and if there are any relevant modifications they should be described briefly.

Manuscripts containing data generated from animal and/or human studies must specify the committee and the institution that approved the experimental protocols used to generate these data.

g. Results and Discussion

The results and discussion should be presented clearly and concisely in continuation to Materials and Methods (see <u>template</u>). Results and Discussion can be presented as separate headings or they can be combined together. If they are presented separately, do not repeat the information in the discussion which is already presented in the results section. Avoid extensive citations and review of the literature. Do not present same data in more than one figure or table or both in a figure and a table.

h. Conclusions

The main conclusions of the study should be presented in a short paragraph, which may stand alone or form a subsection of a Discussion or Results and Discussion section.

i. Acknowledgment

This section is optional. It should appear at the end of the manuscript after Conclusions and before References (see <u>template</u>). This section should acknowledge financial support, technical assistance, gifts, etc. List here those individuals who provided help during the research (e.g., providing language help, writing assistance or proof reading the article, etc.).

j. References

References may be placed at the end of the manuscript on a separate page after Conclusions and Acknowledgement (see <u>template</u>). There is no limit of references for research articles and review articles. As a general criteria the review articles should contain a minimum of 40 references, most of which should be of latest articles. Mini reviews should contain at least 15 and maximum of 40 references. Short communications and case reports should contain a maximum of 25 and 15 references, respectively.

References should be numbered consecutively as superscript in the order in which they are first mentioned in the text, for e.g. citation¹, citation²⁻⁵, citation^{1,5,9-12}, etc. Please

ensure that every reference cited in the text is also present in the reference list (and vice versa). The responsibility for accuracy of references with correct spelling lies with the respective authors. Unpublished results and personal communications are not recommended in the reference list, but may be mentioned in the text. All references should follow the standard reference style of the journal. The general arrangement, abbreviations of journal names and punctuations followed are as per the NLM Catalog (Journals referenced in the NCBI Databases or available on PUBMED): http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/nlmcatalog/journals. Please pay attention to the style of references and punctuations as follows:

k. Tables

Insert tables on appropriate positions within the text. Prepare tables by using the Table function option given in MS Office. Do not prepare tables by using 'tab' or 'spacebar' keys. Number them consecutively with Arabic numerals in the order of their appearance in the text and supply a brief title for each table above it. Tables should be self-explanatory and avoid duplication of the material presented in a figure. Place footnotes to tables below the table body and indicate them with superscript lowercase letters (for e.g. a). Explain all non-standard abbreviations that are used in each table in footnotes. Fully borrowed, adapted, and modified tables should not be reproduced without obtaining permission and a credit line should be provided in the footnote. See template for further guidance.

l. Figures

Insert figures on appropriate positions within the text. Number them consecutively with Arabic numerals in the order of their appearance in the text and supply a brief title for each figure below it (see template). Figures should be self-explanatory and avoid duplication of the material presented in a table. Figures should be good quality and appropriate size in order to facilitate the reader. Permission to reproduce any borrowed illustration must be obtained from the author and the publisher. A credit line should appear in the caption or as a footnote for such figures. The Journal reserves the right to crop, rotate, reduce, or enlarge the photographs to an acceptable size.

For International Authors

All international authors can submit their manuscript online only by clicking the link **Submit the Manuscript**. They are not required to submit any hard copies unless requested by the Editorial Office.

REVIEW POLICY

The editor holds the right to reject or send back any manuscript before being considered for reviewing due to lack of originality, poor presentation, not following instruction for authors, etc. All manuscripts submitted to the journal will be peer-reviewed by two or more reviewers. Based on the remarks of the reviewers the decision about the manuscript will be taken by the editor. The comments and suggestions (acceptance / rejection / minor or major revision) received from reviewers are conveyed to the corresponding author. If required, the author is requested to provide a point by point response to reviewers' comments and submit a revised version of the manuscript. All the changes made should be marked as red in order to facilitate reviewing. This process is repeated till reviewers and editors are satisfied with the manuscript.

SUGGEST REVIEWERS

The authors are also required to provide the names of at least two potential reviewers at the time of submission with their complete postal and email address. The reviewers should not be affiliated with the same institutes as the contributor(s). However, the selection of these reviewers is at the sole discretion of the editor.

TRANSFER OF COPYRIGHTS AND ORIGINALITY FORM

It is mandatory to submit the <u>transfer of copyright and originality form</u> at the time of initial submission of the article. The form can be uploaded from the journals website by clicking the link above. All authors should sign it and email the scanned form or post the duly signed hard copy to the editorial office. In case if it is not possible to all authors to sign the form than the corresponding author can submit it on behalf of all authors.

By submitting the paper, the Author (Authors if a multi-authored paper) confirms the following:
